MARSH FARM FUTURES TO HOLD "COMMUNITY CONVERSATIONS" LOCAL ISSUES - LOCAL SOLUTIONS - community businesses could be the answer

Marsh Farm Futures (MFF) is kick-starting the Power to Change - Empowering Places Programme, with Community Conversations with local residents, community organisations/groups and partners.

The key objectives include:

- Introducing community businesses and demonstrating their success in other places.
- Enabling local residents to identify the key issues (e.g. education, unemployment, crime and business initiatives) affecting the local community, prioritising them and working with people to establish community businesses.
- Inspiring residents, partners and stakeholders to make the most of this opportunity to improve lives using community business as a driver for social change.

Programme Manager, Ishaq Kazi, said "We are absolutely delighted to host the first Community Conversations with residents and others who have an interest in this area. In my view, this programme is all about local people identifying local issues and finding local solutions using community business principles. I am really looking forward to welcoming everyone and their ideas".

Community Conversation will be held during late summer at Futures House

The purpose of this is:

- To develop an understanding of economic, environmental, social needs/issues in the area and how community businesses can help these.
- To ensure local residents, community groups, partners and other stakeholders are involved and collectively drive the Empowering Places Programme (EPP) through developing community businesses.

During the first Community Conversations, residents will meet key members of MFF Team leading on the programme, colleagues from Power to Change and other national organisations committed to providing support and resources to the area. The evening programme will include laughter, discussion, identifying key issues and agreeing the next steps.

Process

An interaction between residents, service providers, and users is required and necessary resources need to be identified. MFF (with support from other National organisations including New Economics Foundation (NEF), UK COOPs), will facilitate discussion in small

groups. This will help ascertain real information, data and the size of problems and possible solutions. Light refreshments will be provided. 

Police & Public Meeting

A public meeting was recently organised by Bedfordshire police to discuss the current rise in knife crime in Luton. The meeting was attended by over 150 members of the public and highlighted issues concerning knife crime and what the public is expecting from the police.

Assistant Chief Constable, Jackie Sebire said: "We are one piece of the puzzle in terms of driving down knife crime, and we can't do it alone. Therefore it was really important for us to meet with people from the communities we serve to have a frank and honest discussion about knife crime, which has risen nationally in recent years. I'm pleased we were able to speak to people about the work we're doing to tackle knife crime, and how important it is for us to do this.

"Even more importantly though, we were able to hear from the public about their thoughts on knife crime, and how we can continue to tackle this. The meeting was incredibly valuable, and we will continue to engage with our communities moving forward."
