Since the COVID-19 outbreak Marsh Farm Futures (MFF) has been working with its partners to collate useful information that can be shared with you. Unfortunately, following Governments advice last

week MFF has had to temporarily close Futures House to the public and we continue to monitor developments and advice from the Government. Some key services continue to be provided, including the foodbank that will still be operating on Monday's from 11.00 am to 1.00 pm from a mobile unit in the front car park at Futures House and tenants who continue to work with vulnerable individuals.

MFF team are still working remotely and is fully set up to continue to keep our communication lines open to residents. We would ask people to e-mail us rather than telephone so that we can direct your requests to the most appropriate member of our team to deal with. If you would like to get in touch for any reason please e-mail info@marshfarmfutures.co.uk

Some of the information that we managed to collate includes details for employed and the self-employed. You will have no doubt heard about the help in place from the Government for Job Retention scheme, where 80% of your salary will be paid and other help for the self-employed. Other recent announcements include reclaiming Statutory Sick Pay, Business interruption loans and Grant funding, holiday for business rates payable as well as VAT payment deferral. Further information is available on the 'gov.uk' website. If Marsh Farm Futures can help with any details on these please do contact us. We would always recommend that you seek specific and independent legal advice before making any strategic decisions for your business.

If you are struggling, need advice or a sounding board, or would just like to share what is going on for you, simply e-mail info@ marshfarmfutures.co.uk with a subject heading 'Talk to us'. One of our support team will get in touch to arrange a one to one call. They will

listen and be there for you. If they can't support you directly, then they will link you with the information or contacts that they can.

Cyber Security workshop

Futures Business Voice hosted a free Cyber Security workshop on 29th January 2020 at Futures House. Presented by Sean O'Neil, Fraud & Cyber Security Advisor for Bedfordshire Police, the two-hour workshop focused on known and new cyber threats and how to avoid becoming a victim of cyber-crime.

Key advice to take into consideration:

Always Install the latest software & app updates

Cyber criminals use weaknesses in software and apps to attack your devices and steal your identity. Software and app updates are designed to fix these weaknesses.

Don't 'jailbreak' or 'root' your smartphone

Switching off software restrictions leaves your phone vulnerable to malicious software compete in global economy. or applications (malware), which can infect your phone and damage or delete data including your valuable photos and videos.

Always back-up your most important data

Don't use public Wi-Fi to transfer sensitive information such as card details

Safeguard your most important data - such as your photos and key documents, by backing them up to an external hard drive or a cloud-based storage system.

Programmes Manager and event organiser, Ishaq Kazi said: "As Cyber criminals get more and more sophisticated in obtaining sensitive and personal information it is extremely important to keep up to date with new threats and how to prevent them. The feedback from attendees was very positive and we will be looking to hold more of these workshops as needed."

This forum is intended to identify key issues affecting businesses. The intention is to increase collaboration between businesses and develop new ways to compete in global economy.

Power to Change - Empowering Places Programme

Comes to an end after two years

I work on Power to Change's Empowering Places programme, which seeks to use community business as a mechanism to make places better by tackling local issues. Through the programme we work closely with locally rooted catalyst organisations, in urban neighbourhoods. We had the pleasure of working with Marsh Farm Futures for two years on this programme (until the end of 2019) and in this time worked closely with the organisation to understand local challenges and opportunities. One of the key questions we tackled together was what role Marsh Farm Futures could play in being a catalyst for community business and local change, and how as a community anchor organisation it could become a better agent for building local power.

We have been pleased to support Ishag Kazi-Project Manager, Mohammed Rafi (CEO) and the Board of Marsh Farm Futures to reflect upon their role and to develop ideas for reviving Community Voice as a mechanism for local community members to have a greater say in the organisation – we hope that this will be an opportunity that is seized by diverse members of the community who feel they want more control over local decisions. We have also been pleased to support other objectives set out by Marsh Farm Futures when they entered the programme, including the development of a Community Business Resource Pack and training programmes with the University of Bedfordshire. Through a relationship with Groundwork there is also work underway to develop Marsh Farm Futures as a food hub and to envisage more productive uses of the green spaces around Futures House, with the first project supporting disabled young adults at Heywood House Day Centre to grow vegetables for the food bank.

We hope the Marsh Farms Futures'

ongoing work to engage more openly with its community continues from strength to strength and that the team continues with its desire to help many more interesting and much needed local projects to spring forth from the increased community use of the Futures House.

Ambassadors of Change - Success Story

Shoyaine Nembhard, against the odds, has gained a 2:1 degree in Youth and Community Development from De Montfort University. Shoyaine took part in the Marsh Farm Futures' Ambassadors of Change Project for young adults who are on a transitional pathway to changing their lives.

The Ambassadors of Change Young Adults project, funded by a grant

from the Police Crime and Commissioner's Office, was a partnership strategy led by Marsh Farm Futures (MFF), The Walk to Freedom Foundation and Develop.

The Walk to Freedom
Foundation helps
young people through
mentoring, selfdevelopment, workshops
and other programmes to
change their mindset about being

involved in serious youth violence, gang exploitation, knife crime, adolescent drug abuse and lack of self-worth.

Having interrupted his university degree course due to mental health, Shoyaine was battling several challenges while living in a local hostel." In a vulnerable state and unsure of the direction to take, a fellow young person in the hostel who was on the programme, encouraged him to attend a session at

He joined the Personal Development course in Futures House.

Shoyaine spoke about what the Ambassadors of Change Project did for him: "I was lost and in a very dark place

when I was introduced to Cathy and joined the Ambassadors Programme. It gave me a sense of belonging, family and community which I was lacking at that time. Most importantly, it helped me believe in myself."

"It wasn't easy at all, if anything, it was tough! I was encouraged to think 'I can' rather than 'I can't' and experienced tough love, from 'this new

me that not only was uni possible, but I mattered, which made a world of difference. I had so many parts of me that needed healing, it felt like a losing battle,

and started to believe in myself. I decided to go back to university and have now attained a 2:1 in my course. It has been a tough road, I'm not entirely there, but I see a future and I see what I want to do - youth work, helping other young people struggling with life to see a way forward."

Cathy McShane, Youth and Communities Manager for Marsh Farm Futures said: "I am incredibly proud of him.

"Programmes like this can offer a lifeline to 'at risk' young people. We rely on funding to be able to offer this and other services that are so important in the community. We will be working with partner organisations that we hope can offer a similar programme in the future."

L&D Radio Moves into Futures House



After nearly sixty years of providing programmes to patients in local hospitals, L&D Radio needed to find a new home. After a thorough search we found suitable space in Marsh Farm Futures House and set out to build a pair of new studios. Our programmes are sent to a medium wave transmitter at the L&D Hospital and streamed to the internet, so can be received on most home and car radios as well as mobile phones, tablets and smart speakers.

From the start our move took approximately three months including design, purchase of new equipment and construction of new studios, during which we maintained our programmes for all but two hours when we had to transfer the transmitter signal between the old and new studios. We are grateful to specialist company, Transplan, who outfitted

For many members of the station, the move was guite emotional as we built up our facilities over a long time, and while the equipment was old, it was reliable even though it sometimes needed nursing along. Mike Ollivier, Chair of the group, said, "The move was a bittersweet occasion for us all - a sadness at saying goodbye to the old, an excited anticipation of the new. These new studios are a reward for many years effort by everyone concerned. But more, this is an opportunity for us to extend our audience to many other health facilities in the area, nursing homes, GP surgeries, while offering training to people who would like to learn more about working in radio."

Arts Club brings Community Together

I started my Art club in 2002 at the Sundon Park Community Centre .I was welcomed there as an attractive addition to their other community activities.

At that time the Council ran the Centre for Sundon Park Community members who set up there in 2000 and had organised a number of various classes

Under the supervision of local man Pat Shane ,who is still overall director today, a Charitable Trust was set up and I was later



appointed as one of their directors I attended regular meetings thereafter with the trust and often with council members and our local MP.

By this time the Council were mainly acting in a supervisory position and the Trust was running all the day to day activities for the Centre.

My art club became a success as it was the only one in the area and we had a membership of approx. 35-40 members. Part of this success was due to keeping prices low so everyone could benefit and be included in this community activity.

In 2012, we were told that our beloved Centre was about to be pulled down. So the Trust and all its activities including my club moved in to Lealands School on February 5th 2013.

I soon discovered from feedback from members and my personal experiences, that this venue was not suitable for our needs and reluctantly looked around for other alternatives. I approached Futures House who had a community spirit in line with my own and was made most welcome.

The art club started at Futures on Tuesday 7th May 2013 and we have had a very happy association with all their personnel for the last seven years.

We meet every Tuesday evening from 7pm to 9 pm. Fee £3 and Wednesday mornings 9-30 am to 12-30 pm fee £4.

All are welcome to join. Well behaved Children under 16 are also welcome with a Parent or family member at our Tuesday night sessions. There is no charge for the first session for any future member.

We run various events throughout the year such as painting out days, demonstrations and workshops given by professional artists plus two major art exhibitions in the Spring and Autumn/Winter

Funds permitting, we would like to organise more outside events involving coach trips in the future.

In the meantime many thanks to Marsh Farm Futures for all the assistance given in the past and hopefully the future.

Groundwork

Environmental Agency comes to support MFF

Local community charity Groundwork East has been working with Marsh Farm Futures to create a number of raised beds to enable local residents of Marsh Farm and volunteers and staff of disability groups based at Futures House to grow their own fruit and vegetables. Not only will this help to provide fresh, locally grown produce but it will also allow the volunteers to benefit from being active outside and all the physical and mental health benefits that this brings.

"We are pleased to have been involved and to support this project at such a well-used community resource and which we hope will soon develop further by Marsh Farm Futures becoming involved in Groundwork's lottery funded Community Food Hub project to involve even more Luton residents in food growing" said Gill Taylor, Operations Director of Groundwork East.

We are also keen to work with Marsh Farm Futures on the other small green spaces around the building to ensure that maximum benefits can be gained through creating improved landscapes in which centre users can sit and relax and spend time with one another.



Groundwork is also working with Luton Borough Council and the Environment Agency on nearby Leagrave Common to identify potential improvements to the river and surrounding habitats and is

looking forward to engaging with the Marsh Farm Community in the summer on opportunities available.







Marsh Farm Regeneration Completes Another Milestone



The completion of Phase 3 of the transformation of Marsh Farm was celebrated on 27th February. Residents, local councillors and representatives of Keech Hospice, Luton Council and ENGIE,



delivery of the whole regeneration project, were present to witness the unveiling of a commemorative plaque.

John Healey MP, Shadow Secretary of State for Housing and Denise Elcock-Jules unveiled the plaque on Anthony Jules Court, named in honour of her late husband, Tony, who had been part of the original Marsh Farm regeneration steering group. Whilst terminally ill, Anthony had helped raise over £40,000 for local charity, Keech Hospice.

Denise said: "I am delighted to be here today. Marsh Farm meant such a lot to Tony. To think that future generations will be made aware of his legacy is truly humbling and together with his sons I am honoured to see him remembered in this way."

John Healey said: "I am proud to join Denise today to unveil this plaque to Anthony Jules.

The final phase comprises 83 apartments, 11 houses, play areas, parking and new landscaping. The housing is all affordable rented accommodation for council residents. Of the houses, four of them are four-bedroom homes, of which two are dedicated to families with disabilities, including ground floor double bedrooms and wet rooms with capacity for a through floor lift to enable users to have access to all parts of the home. The properties have been built to life time homes standards.

Cllr Tom Shaw, portfolio holder for Housing, said: "This is a momentous day not just for

Marsh Farm but for the whole town. We are committed to providing top quality buildings local people can make their homes. Incoming investment is being translated not only in to bricks and mortar, but opportunities



for residents as we work towards our goal of tackling poverty by 2040."

The extensive £32m scheme is part of the council's ongoing commitment to regenerating Luton, attracting new businesses to the town and offering more local jobs for local people. The project has also provided valuable apprenticeships for school leavers looking to begin a career in the construction industry.

Mohammed Rafi CEO Marsh Farm Futures said: "It's great to see this wonderful housing scheme reach its final milestone, originally with the completion of the new shops and now the residential phase. I am very proud that MFF has been a key partner in this development, being an active partner in the steering group, facilitator for local community consultation in Futures House, providing meeting space for local residents to give their views on the planning and other consultation phases and jointly employing a local resident as an apprentice, who eventually secured a full time job as a trainee surveyor, with the developer, Engie".

The entire scheme was designed in partnership with the Marsh Farm Steering Group which consisted of residents, businesses and key stakeholders from the Marsh Farm estate.
